Academic requirements	50-60% average +
Language requirements for non-native speakers of English	www.qmu.ac.uk/study-here/international-students/english-language-requirements/ . Students coming for one semester can have exemption from an IELTS test if taught and assessed in English at home institution. Home institution should provide a supporting letter as part of the application.

Full-time course load	60 SCOTCAT credits (equivalent to 30 ECTS) per semester, usually 3 modules
Courses available to Exchange and Study Abroad students	Request module descriptors by emailing StudyAbroad@qmu.ac.uk detailing which subject area(s) you are interested in, which level (2/3) and which semester(s) you wish to attend QMU.
Course restrictions	Depends on previous depth of study in a subject area. Generally, subjects in Allied Health courses and Acting and Performance are not possible.
Language courses	English language support available from our Effective Learning Service www.qmu.ac.uk/study-here/student-services/effective-learning-service-els/ . No credit attached.
Course registration	Once students have been accepted onto the programme, they will be emailed the modules open to them and they should email their course choices to AcademicAdministration@qmu.ac.uk . Students will be registered for modules just before arrival at QMU.
Transcripts	Transcripts are available after the Exam Board in June each year. Students can obtain a letter of unconfirmed grades earlier than this from AcademicAdministration@qmu.ac.uk if required, or if the final transcript is required more urgently request a Convenor's Action (this can't be guaranteed).

Nomination by home institution	Home institution should email nominations to QMU and then students can be supplied the application details.	
Application by nominated students	Students should complete the online application form https://u.qmu.ac.uk/live/sits.urd/run/siw_ipp_lgn.login?process=siw_ipp_app_crs , selecting Study Abroad (Undergraduate) as the course. Within the application, students can then select up to three areas of study. As part of the application process, students can upload copies of supporting documents – transcripts, details of modules being currently studied and not yet graded, proof of English language proficiency (if relevant), one academic reference and a copy of the passport photo page.	
Visa application (if required)	Students coming for one semester should come to the UK as a Standard Visitor www.gov.uk/standard-visitor-visa . We will supply a supporting letter to use for this purpose. Students coming for a full academic or calendar year should come on a Student visa www.gov.uk/student-visa .
