# Student exchange vs study abroad

## Student Exchange Program

### Inbound (one or two semesters)

The Student Exchange Program is available for students enrolled at one of our partner universities. Approved exchange students can study one or two semesters and receive a tuition fee waiver for their international exchange program and do not pay fees to Swinburne under the agreed reciprocal exchange arrangement.

To study at Swinburne as an exchange student, you must be nominated by one of Swinburne's partner universities.

## Study Abroad Program

### Inbound (one or two semesters)

The Study Abroad Program is available to students enrolled at a university – either a partner or non-partner university. Students can study at Swinburne on a fee-paying basis for one or two semesters and can choose to undertake three or four units. Students enrolled in a Study Abroad Program are charged tuition fees for the program. Students from one of our partner universities may receive a discount on the tuition fees.

# How to apply

## Student exchange application

### Eligibility

To be eligible for the Student Exchange Program you must have successfully completed one year of study at a higher education institution and meet all entry requirements. You can find more information [here](#). Your home university may also have their own entry requirements for the exchange program.

### How to apply

Students will need to contact their home institution to be nominated as a candidate for the Student Exchange Program at Swinburne. Only students who have an approved nomination will be able to submit an application.

International Baccalaureate (IB)	At least grade 4 in English A, English B Standard Level or Higher Level
Denmark	Studentereksamen: Grade 7 in English Level or Grade 10 in English Level B
Germany	Fachhochschulereife: 3 in English Abitur: 7 in English DAAD Language test: 4 stars in all sections
Netherlands	Voorbereidend Wetenschappelijk Onderwijs: 6 in English HAVO: 7 in English MBO: 7 in English
Norway	Vitnemal den Videragaende Skole: 4 in English
Sweden	Avgangsbetyg/Slutbetyg: VG in English

For study abroad and exchange programs, students may provide an official letter from their home university stating that they meet English requirements equivalent to B2 of the Common European Framework.

**Note:** English language proficiency can be no more than three years prior to commencing studies at Swinburne (and no more than five years for students from Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Austria, Netherlands, and Switzerland)



# More information

## Application tips

**Developing your study plan:** You will need to find and select the classes (units) you wish to study at Swinburne. You must nominate at least 8 units at the time of application for assessment.

**Search for units:** You can search for units and get a detailed unit description by using the [single unit search engine](#). You can also browse through our courses or search by study area [here](#).

It is the student's responsibility to make sure that the classes/units chosen will be credited back to their home university.

## Visa

Upon [acceptance of your offer letter](#), Swinburne will send you a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) for your visa application.

## Study load

International students are required to take on a full-time study load per semester for visa purposes. At Swinburne:

- the minimum full-time study load is 37.5 credit points
- the maximum full-time study load is 50 credit points.

Most units of study (but not all) equal 12.5 credits, so students may study 3 or 4 classes per semester, across all Swinburne study areas. Students can mix and match classes to suit their needs, as long as they meet the required prerequisites for the classes they choose.

## Health insurance

All international students on a student visa must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) as part of Australian visa regulations. This cover provides medical and hospital insurance. You and your dependents must maintain suitable OSHC for the duration of your visa. Swinburne can arrange this health cover on student's behalf. For more information, visit our [website](#).

## Living in Melbourne

Study abroad and exchange students will be based at our main campus in Hawthorn. Just ten minutes by train from Melbourne's city centre, Hawthorn is blessed with boutique shops, parks, restaurants, public transport, a cinema, gym and public swimming pool.
